

Water and Sewer Rate Change

Effective April 1, 2007, the City of Kitchener increased our water and sewer rates. **The water rate is now \$1.1827/m³. The sewer rate is \$1.1920/m³.** These new rate increases translate to approximately \$3.66 a month for the average household. To maintain our commitment to water and sewer system renewal, we have balanced a 9.9% increase in wholesale water and a 14.9% increase in sewage treatment rates with continued investment in renewal and our desire to keep rates low. The City of Kitchener and Kitchener Utilities are committed to providing residents with quality water and sewer reliability for today and into the future.
