That's why the City of Kitchener observes the Region of Waterloo's Water Conservation By-law. By watering outdoors on certain days of the week, you can help our community maintain a constant, safe supply of drinking water.

The Water Conservation By-Law: All Summer Long

The Region of Waterloo's Water Conservation By-law is in effect every year from May 31 to September 30. It allows you to water your lawn once per week. And it permits the watering of gardens, trees, shrubs and car washing on alternating days.

Residents, businesses and institutions are permitted to water one day per week. Your lawn-watering day is based on the last digit of your address:

If your address ends in	Your watering day is
0 or 1	Monday
2 or 3	Tuesday
4 or 5	Wednesday
6 or 7	Thursday
8 or 9	Friday

When: **5:30 a.m. to 10 a.m.**
and 7 p.m. to 11 p.m.



Addresses that are even may water gardens, trees and shrubs and wash cars on even-numbered calendar dates, while odd numbered addresses may do so on odd-numbered dates.

Example: 50 King St. can water their lawn on Monday, while 55 King St. can water their lawn on Wednesday.

Working on your Lawn?

Permits are required for new sod and seed plantings.
